The School

The Plattsburgh City School District serves students in the city of Plattsburgh. Approximately 1,900 students attend classes in grades pre-kindergarten through twelve. Three elementary schools: Bailey Avenue, Oak Street and Arthur P. Momot provide academic and social services for students in pre-kindergarten through grade five. Stafford Middle School provides services for grades six through eight. Plattsburgh High School (PHS) serves approximately 600 students in grades nine through 12.

Students at PHS may pursue a variety of courses designed to provide academic rigor. In addition to required courses established by New York State for graduation with a Regents Diploma, PHS offers students Advanced Placement (AP) courses through the College Board. PHS also collaborates with Clinton Community College and the State University of New York at Plattsburgh to offer students a variety of courses for college credit.

PHS also maintains a partnership with the John W. Harrold Education Center affiliated with the Board of Cooperative Educational Services/Champlain Valley Technical Education Center (CV-TEC). Students in their junior and senior years may attend CV-TEC to pursue studies including: allied health, animal science, automotive body repair, automotive technology, building trades, cosmetology, culinary arts, digital art and design, early childhood education, environmental conservation, graphic communication and design, heavy equipment and diesel repair, hospitality and resort services, medical/legal office assisting, Plattsburgh Aeronautical Institute, security and law enforcement, small engine mechanics and repair technology and welding.

PHS offers foreign language studies in French, Spanish, German and Farsi. PHS offers a dynamic vocal and instrumental music program. PHS students are able to enroll in electives in core subject areas. PHS students are able to join an array of clubs, activities and athletic teams.

Class Rank

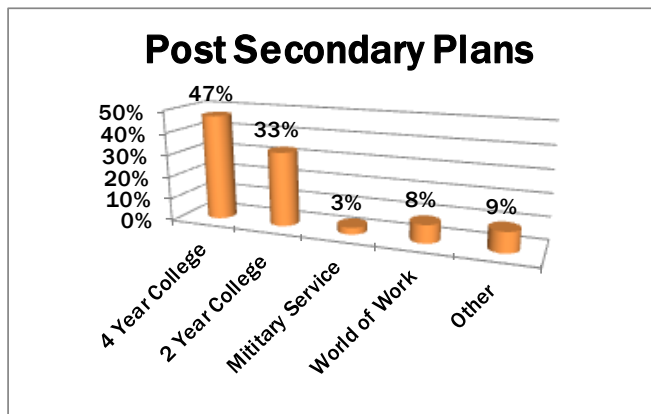
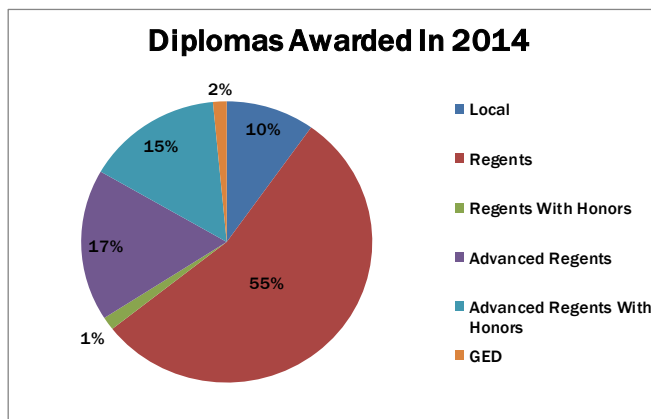
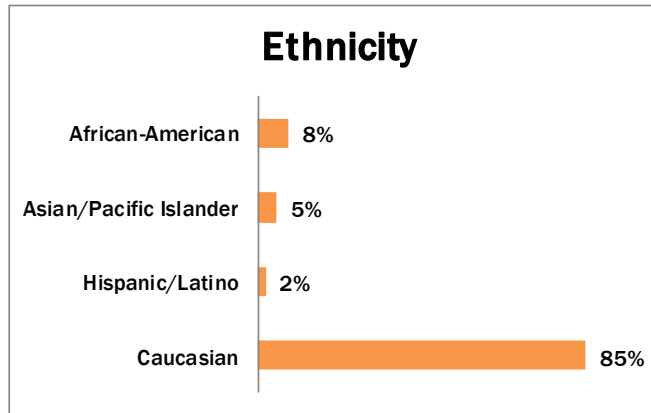
The class rank is unweighted and is determined by averaging all grades for course work. Class rank is calculated at the end of the junior and senior years.
